#### Making the Church a Home

In today's readings we hear about small things having large impacts. In the Gospel, Jesus says that the kingdom of heaven "is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs and puts forth large branches so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade."

The mustard seed in this parable represents the Gospel that Jesus came to proclaim. It started with just a small handful of people but now, 2000 years later, has spread to all the corners of the world. The birds that come to find refuge in the tree represents all of us who come to find rest and shelter in the Gospel and the Church.

As stewards, we should play our part in helping the tree continue to grow through the gift of our time and talents. We should seek ways to help spread the Gospel message in our parish, whether it be through assisting at liturgies, helping with catechesis or serving the poor in our community. We should also spread the message that God desires all of us, even those who have fallen away from their faith, to find healing, safety, and comfort in the Church. Let us be committed to making the Church a home for all who seek Christ.

#### Summary

In today's Gospel we hear about the parable of the mustard seed in which Jesus explains that the tiniest seed can grow into the largest tree that houses many birds of the air. The mustard seed represents the Gospel message that began with a few people 2000 years ago and has now spread all over the world. As stewards, we should play our part in helping the tree continue to grow through the gift of our time and talents.



#### National Indigenous Peoples Day June 21, 2024

National Indigenous Peoples Day has officially been celebrated in Canada since 1996. It is an occasion to celebrate the rich culture and heritage of the First Nations, Inuit and Métis Peoples. Pope Francis has often spoken of the beauty of Indigenous culture. We recall in a special way the words he spoke to the Canadian Delegation he welcomed to the Vatican on April 1, 2022:

"First, your care for the land, which you see not as a resource to be exploited, but as a gift of heaven. For you, the land preserves the memory of your ancestors who rest there; it is a vital setting making it possible to see each individual's life as part of a greater web of relationships, with the Creator, with the human community, with all living species and with the earth, our common home. All this leads you to seek interior and exterior harmony, to show great love for the family and to possess a lively sense of community. Then too, there are the particular riches of your languages, your cultures, your traditions and your forms of art. These represent a patrimony that belongs not only to you, but to all humanity, for they are expressions of our common humanity."

As common home to us all, the land is the place where we must "walk together" in peace and harmony for the good of everyone. Indigenous cultures and traditions form a precious heritage, which can guide our shared journey. Today, walking alongside Canada's Indigenous Peoples, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops reaffirms its commitment to deepen and strengthen relationships Indigenous Peoples with through truth, healing, justice, reconciliation and hope

The month of June contains the feast days of many familiar saints. Next Saturday, June 22<sup>nd</sup>, the church celebrates the martyrdom of Saint John Fisher and Saint Thomas More. Both John Fisher and Sir Thomas More refused to take the oath required by King Henry VIII's Act of Succession, refusing to acknowledge Henry as supreme head of the Church of England and the annulment of his marriage to Catherine of Aragon, especially because it repudiated papal authority. They were imprisoned in the Tower of London and executed in 1535.

The Archdiocese of Toronto has named two Parishes after these saints: **St. John Fisher** (in Brampton) and **St. Thomas More**
