



June 29<sup>th</sup>, the Feast Day of Saints Peter and Paul, honors the <u>martyrdom</u> in <u>Rome</u> of the <u>apostles</u> <u>Saint Peter</u> and <u>Saint Paul</u>, <u>patron saints</u> of the Eternal City. Since the beginnings of Christianity, the two founding fathers of the church have been honored together, even in the early Christian wall markings in the catacombs outside Rome. In art, St. Peter is often shown holding the keys to the kingdom of heaven, and Saint Paul is portrayed with a sword and a book recalling his persecuting Christians as Saul, before his miraculous conversion, and referring to his many epistles to communities in the early church.
